- o Carol Deeley, President and Founder
- Teen opportunity, Gabriel was 12 lost to suicide, help other youth started orgainzation
- Less than a year old, suicide leading cause of death for young people. Suicide rates 10-14 year, especially African American youth. Children as young as 8 die from suicide.
- Warning signs are given to other students. Help students know to take the talk of suicide seriously.
- MIssion to prevet suicide through intervention, help with social media, bullying, and idgital drama.
- Parental controls search bullying and suicide on school computer using computer safe technoloty in schools. Could intervene.
- o Training Youth Ambassador Program. The program is not virtual. 10+ can apply to the program.
- High School social media program teaches how to use social media in a positive light. Starts this Wednesday.
- September is Sucide Prevention month, October is anti- bullying month.

### Stob Hotel, 862 N Orleans, Development Update

- City Planning Department made developer change from DX7 to Planned Development, building is LEED certified.
- Footprint hasn't changed, Setback is the same 12-13 foot back Orleans is a narrow sidewalk, no on-site parking. Owners have secured parking off site within walking distance, went from 60-66 rooms, floor height added per floor added height 15 feet overall went from 95 - 108 feet. Rooms were added to offset cost.
- 9th floor Rooftop area, ½ covered open air space with another area has a small patio, Imagine the restaurant on the first floor will use the space. This space will be accessible to the community through restaurant. There is an indoor bathroom on this floor as well.
- Employment have been working with the Alderman's office and bound by city regulations for minority contractors, Pepper construction has already met with Alderman's office.
- Vote by Zoom pool, 96% voted in favor 4% voted against development.
