- 9th District Senator Lakesia Collins
- Discussion about the Illinois SafeT act.
 - SafeT evolved into a law. In 2017 a man waiting 3 years in pretrial for stealing a backpack because he couldn't afford bail for a crime he hadn't been convicted of doing, but in the meantime while waiting for trial he committed suicide. A documentary was made by JayZ that cataloged this man's journey.
 - A majority of those in pretrial holding who couldn't make bail were black and brown persons. If you had money you could get out even if the crime was the same.
 - The "no bail" portion of the law went to the Supreme Court which upheld the SafeT provision for no cash bail.
 - Judge can hold individuals in jail for crimes the Judge believes are violent or crimes that the Judge sees fits to remand an individual for.
 - Need more staff and funding from the State to make sure this part of the law is implemented properly.
- Cornerstone Children's Learning Center
 - Cari Christoff, Executive Director
 - Takes children 6 weeks to 6 years old.
 - Discuss pandemic effects and experience.
 - There are 6 classrooms. There is an indoor motor room, playground on rook NAEYC accredited, play based learning, child directed.
 - Growfit, healthy, no juice, children get physical exercise and have supportive teachers. Support diversity. And have internal Scholarships for families who may need financial support.
- Trails School for Early Learning
 - Jessica Horak, Director & Founder
 - Takes children 6 weeks to 6 years old. There is capacity for 75 students now there are 65 students. 25% of students speak another language.
 - Discuss pandemic effects and experience.

- Had a mental health consultant from the States. Work with the whole family, use the Reggio philosophy, Teachers have a lot of professional development.
- There are grants for financial assistance, CCAP Illinois Child Care Assistance Program.
- YWCA
 - Angela McNealy, Youth and Educational Coordinator
 - YWCA is a partner with CHA through their Family Works program. YWCA is located at 904 N Cambridge in the Rowhouses.
 - Family mental health and wellness, meals, blessing in a backpack, Llttle Llbrary, Tutoring and provide safe spaces for youth.
 - There is consistent assessment and date collection for program success.
- Chicago Police Department
 - Kameria Powell, Youth Service Coordinator, Office of Community Policing
 - Discuss the YDAC, the Youth District Advisory Council for the Chicago Police. There is a YDAC is each of the 22 Police Districts. Include Youth voice.
 - Interact with youth though the Police Explorer program, Peer Jury, Cops kids Chess. Sharon Boyd, also runs programs for CPD youth.
 - Area 3, 16-24 year olds can receive pay for participating in certain programs.
- 18th District Asylum Seeker and Migrant Update
 - Jennifer Allen, RCC Refugee Community Connection
 - Brad Kessler, 18th District Community Council
 - Discuss process of what is happening at the 18th District Police station in regards to arriving migrant families.
 - Migrants sent on buses from Texas to Chicago. Right now people are sleeping at the 18th District station.
 - Inn of Chicago is a shelter in the 18th District.
 - Deputy Mayor for immigration Ms. Ponce De Leon.
 - Across the city there are 12,000 people in 15 shelters.
 - Children are registering in school. Looking to set up English classes.
 - Priority for Shelter is for families then single men.
