  - Sara Mathers, First Deputy of Community Engagement, Office of the Mayor
    - Discuss role of Community Engagement office.
      - Talked about the Budget engagement process that occurred throught the city.
    - Discuss unhoused and the need to increase beds in the city.
      - There are 3000 beds now and the Mayor's office would like to have this increase to 10,000 beds citywide for the homeless.
      - 1300 shelters
        - Social services in shelters.
        - The arrival of Asylum seekers means there need to be even more beds to help unhoused.
          - 40% of New Arrivals are under 18 years old.
          - Texas sends people and policies about limiting bus drop offs may be helping limit the amount of people who show up randomly.
          - Anticipate more newly arrived people will keep coming the closer we get to Summer and the Democratic National Convention.
          - Law firms are working to help file work permit paperwork but there are not enough people to help.
    - One Summer Teen Employment Program
      - 24,000 positions
        - 16-24 yr old paid
        - 13-15 yr old
      - Community Safety
      - Environmental Issues
      - Mental Health Hope to open more Mental Health Clinics
  - Try to get more information out to community
- Mark Twain Apartments (Affordable housing)
  - Steve Davis, Assistant Manager
    - Overview,

- Building built 1932, renovated 2018
- 148 units, studios
  - 10 units for CHA for the homeless, with social services by Operation Pathway.
- Help residents apply for SS cards and benefits.
  - A lot of residents work.
- No age requirement for units, ages 20-80.
- 24/7 unarmed security. Acknowledge much of the crime may not be residents of Mark Twain, but residents have communicated they are worried about safety inside and outside the building.
- Security Cameras present.
  - Suggest cameras tie into OEMC. Randall will follow up and connect OEMC with Mark Twain management.

### NNUP Presentation

- CTA Brown Line Sedgwick Stop
  - Conditions under el station
    - 1536 N Sedgwick
    - The CTA did not respond to the invitation to be present at the NNUP 2/26 meeting. CTA has also been on on-going emails outlining conditions under the el for the past two years.
  - Powerpoint presentation given that outlines current conditions under el tracks.
    - Standing muddy water, that breeds mosquitoes, and disease.
    - No lights, very unsafe for residents and students who use the station.
    - Rats and Fly dumping.
      - Suggest CTA engage with the community to address poor conditions under the el stop and suggest they work to finish the 2007 upgrades of the Sedgwick station.
      - Discuss the process to give public comment at the CTA BOard meeting.
